

Fellow fossiliers!!

It's Christmas season, again, and that means we should have more time on our hands, with the holidays, to go fossil collecting!! The Peace River is low, low, low, and very hunt able!! The first step into the water is cold, for sure, brrrrrr, but you get used to it and forget all about it soon enough. For those of you who didn't get your fossil fix at our recent Fossil Show 2008, then you need to go find them yourself. We have a few opportunities available to club members for pit hunting, as well as the river being the right time to go. Almost every Sunday, Gunther Lobich takes a trip into Quality Mining. You need to sign up, in advance, at the meeting, but if there is room, you can get to hunt a pit. Mostly what has been found there has been echinoids, pectin, barnacles and sand dollars, along with a few sprinkling of shells, but they have recently dug into a vertebrate horizon. The members who have gone, and dug earnestly, have been rewarded with some nice finds, Lots of Mammoth material, some Horse, Tapir, Camel, and a few other animals have been found. This is not easy hunting, but it is rewarding. When I recently went I found a mammoth patella (kneecap), a large toe bone, a couple of vertebrae, rib sections, a section of

Tapir maxilla with 2 teeth, the proximal end of a femur from a carnivore (fairly large), and a great big ol'e horse tooth. Other folks found other fossils, including a couple of mammoth teeth. The Sunday after the Fossil Show, Sandy, Donna and Pam hunted it, and I heard they did pretty well. I was not there, but knowing those three, I'm sure it was a giggle-fest!!

Another opportunity to pit hunt, for members, and you must sign up in advance, is the JJJ pit on Farabee road in Charlotte Co., by hwy 31. This is mostly shells, but there are some good ones to be had. If you are a sheller, you need to try and hunt this pit. It is one of the few still active, so they are always exposing more material. Unfortunately, the pit owner only allows access on Monday and Friday, so if you cannot get off work on one of those days, you may not be able to go. Pits are a difficult place to get access in to hunt, especially for a group. Bill, our esteemed president, has done a bang up job of getting us access to these pits and he is trying for more. If you hear of an opportunity that may work for the club, please let us know. A fossil club needs places to hunt!! How else are we to have great show and tell presentations unless we find great fossils?? !! So, let's all do our best to get these old bones and shells before they turn into road fill!! And then

give them to me!!!! Happy hunting!! Louis
